

Texas College Bridge Delivery Format Options with Scheduling Examples

Delivery Format	Scheduling Example	Notes about Student Support & Grades
Stand-Alone Course with Instructor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> College Prep English and/or College Prep Mathematics may be scheduled as a period in the student's day. The course can be scheduled as an elective credit or as an English or mathematics credit (see guidelines below). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teachers of these stand-alone college prep courses need to align instruction & grades to the scope and sequence of the TCB online courses with the understanding that the students must complete the TCB courses to receive course credit.
Imbedded in English and/or Math Class	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students would be scheduled for English and/or mathematics course(s) (such as English IV or AQR). Students would additionally be scheduled for College Prep English and/or Mathematics as an ungraded, pass/fail elective credit. This could be done through a non-campus-based zero period or a class period that could become a late arrival or early release once the college prep course is completed. The teacher assigned to the College Prep Course and the English and/or Mathematics course would be the same. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The teacher would need to schedule time for the TCB courses in the English and/or Mathematics course (such as English IV or AQR). For example, every Tuesday and Thursday may be designated as Texas College Bridge time utilizing a small-group instruction model for the whole class. Grades for TCB progress may be incorporated into the English and/or Math class if the entire class is working on TCB or if there are similar grades for other students. Credit for the College Prep Course must be based on successful completion of the TCB online courses. Credit for the English and/or Mathematics course will be based on assignment grades per local grading policy.
Student Independent Study	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students could be scheduled for a College Prep Course outside of academic hours with an assigned teacher for virtual only support. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No grades would be assigned. The student would be expected to work independently toward expected mastery of the TCB College Prep Course(s).

Credit Guidelines

As an Elective Credit	PEIMS <ul style="list-style-type: none"> CP110100 (ELA) or CP111200 (Math) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will meet graduation requirements through another English and/or mathematics class.
As an English Credit	PEIMS <ul style="list-style-type: none"> CP110100 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students may use College Prep English as a 4th English credit for graduation. The student should not be completing an endorsement that is prohibitive of college prep English. For example, the following endorsements are prohibitive: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Multidisciplinary Option B Arts & Humanities Option F Note: NCAA does not recognize the College Prep courses.
As a Mathematics Credit	PEIMS <ul style="list-style-type: none"> CP111200 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students may use College Prep Mathematics as a 4th math credit for graduation if they've already successfully completed three math credits. Note: NCAA does not recognize the College Prep courses.
