A Checklist for Higher Education Partners



MOU

- Review the Texas College Bridge MOU.** Determine if you will join Texas College Bridge to accept students from all over the state, or if you want to amend your existing MOU with your local ISD partners to include Texas College Bridge content.

Faculty Review

- Have English and Math faculty review the pre-vetted curricula** for EdReady Texas College Bridge.

Signature Page

- If joining the Texas College Bridge MOU, **sign the signature page** and email it as a PDF to TexasCollegeBridge@tea.texas.gov. After we receive your signature page, we will add your institution to the MOU Addendum and to our map on the Texas College Bridge website as a participant.

Primary Contact

- Submit the name and contact information** of your institution's point person(s) for Texas College Bridge to share with districts and interested parties to texascollegebridge@commitpartnership.org.

Receive Records

- Sign on to be a receiver of records** with GreenLight Credentials. This is free and allows access to a portal showing all Certificates of Completion sent to your college.

Inform Others

- Notify relevant college campus staff** that the university is participating in Texas College Bridge and will receive student completion documentation. At the time of high school graduation, students who receive the HB5 TSI exemption for entry-level courses in Reading/Writing and/or Math should be allowed to enroll without developmental classes.
- Reach out to your local school district partners** to invite them to join Texas College Bridge. Encourage your partnering school districts to complete the Texas College Bridge interest form online at TexasCollegeBridge.org/districts.

Monitor Progress

- Help us measure the effectiveness** of Texas College Bridge by adding a marker to students' accounts and reporting comparative data following the first semester.
